From the Rectory

Dear Parishioners,

'I'm dreaming of a white Christmas' is the biggest selling Christmas song of all time. However, it may well be that the days of a White Christmas here in Sussex are becoming a distant memory due to climate change! And even the message of Christmas itself, is it really nothing more than a dream?

In 'Christmas a history' by Judith Flanders, she writes that the rituals of Christmas allow us to believe, if only for a day a year, that a world exists where we are loved, protected and cherished and Christmas, unlike anything else, somehow does appear to offer it all. Christmas does have many traditions that offer us many good things, some of which we can all hopefully enjoy this year. But, Christmas is also celebrating a historical event that offers something more permanent than the ground we stand on.

J R Tolkien an academic scholar at Oxford University last century known best for writing 'The Lord of the Rings' and 'The Hobbit', wrote a much less well known book called 'Tree and Leaf'. In this book he argues that in the Christian story both myth (representing the things we long for) and history have combined, and he argues that the story of the birth of Christ 'has pre-eminently the inner consistency of reality'.

It seems that the main reason that Christmas is so wonderful is not just because it is based around such a good story about how things should be with accompanying rituals, but because the story is actually true and offers us all through the birth of Jesus, the gift of a saving King, not just to be with us at Christmas time but also throughout the year in order that we be indeed loved, protected and cherished.

The heart of the Christmas message is that Jesus was born on Christmas day to save us from our sins as the Angel Gabriel said to Joseph. Elsewhere in the Bible the effect of this salvation for us is spoken of with reference to whiteness "Though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow" (Isaiah 1v18). It can still be for each one of us a 'White Christmas' in deepest sense when we experience Christmas with Christ.

Please do not ignore this wonderful transforming message of a truly wonderful White Christmas being offered us all from God in order to fulfil our greatest hopes and dreams in exchange for, at best, a temporary fix.

Rev Peters Thoughts

My mother was a daughter of the East End of London, living through the devastation of WW2. Her family had been through much in her life. A sister dying at the age of 11, a brother dying from diphtheria and her father dying young, amongst other family tragedies, had left her with an outlook on life that I have attempted to follow. I was wondering what she would say about the present situation in our country, and I could imagine her voice quite clearly, “we are where we are, Peter.” Her attitude was quite simple and straightforward, “we will just get on with it.” So, how would she confront the problems? She was very much, ‘work for the best, but prepare for the worst,’ and so would always be ready to face future eventualities.

And so I thought of her (as indeed I so often do) but especially this time when I sat down to decipher, for the third time in the Parish News, what the latest Government action from the UK's third Prime Minister in 2022 and fourth Chancellor in 2022 was for the country's finances and future. There is little doubt that there are difficult times ahead, interest rates have gone up, along with food prices, and there are threats of power outages and a period of austerity.

We all use energy, and so need to save wherever we can regarding this. First of all, the ‘Price Cap.’ The price cap is not a maximum limit on consumer energy bills, but rather a cap on how much suppliers can charge per kWh of energy used and a maximum daily standing charge. So, the more you use the more you pay, and the less you use, the less you pay.

Chancellor Jeremy Hunt announced that the government's two-year Energy Price Guarantee, originally stated to last for two years from October 2022, will now only last for 6 months. This means that the Energy Price Cap (not the guarantee, but the price cap underneath) will be back from April when the Energy Price Guarantee ends. The projected new energy price cap, which will start in April when the price guarantee ends, will be up 73% taking a bill for typical use (but please don't forget, use more pay more, use less pay less) from £2,500/yr. to £4,350.

The analytics firm, ‘Cornwall Insight’ which makes predictions based on energy costs, such as the price of gas and oil on the open market, thinks the price will then drop slightly in July 2023, although it would still be up by nearly 60% overall when the cap will then be down 15% in July, to £3,700 a year for typical use.

We live in uncertain times, but when I take services at our two Churches, I am standing in the footsteps of those that also lived in and through uncertain times. They faced the Civil War, The Plague, and The Black Death. Two World Wars, the great depression, and the Spanish Flu epidemic.

Yes, we also live in uncertain times, as indeed did my Mum, and she managed not only by being very frugal but also by being a part of a caring community. A community of family and friends that were a supporting group, a caring and sharing supporting group. So, what would my mum's (Helen) response be to what appears to be a disaster.” “This isn't a threat, it's the chance of an amazing new start, so let's get on with

it.”

She would, undoubtedly, be right.

Thank you to those people who support this charity by leaving things in the church at their collection point and also, thank you to those who have already donated small gifts for the children at Christmas, which we are still collecting, so if you could just buy an extra gift with your Christmas shopping, great. The ages they collect for are birth to 17 years, so that gives plenty of scope. If you bring them to the church or give me a ring I can collect. Food is also very welcome, especially things that can go into packs like crisps or chocolate biscuits etc. The team from WUTH give out hot food each evening and also a food pack for the following day. Warm clothes, sleeping bags, tents, blankets etc. Imagine being without shelter what would you need? Also, surprisingly enough dog and cat food, coats etc. often the only friend a homeless person has, is their pet.

Famous Hymns

Good King Wenceslas: John Mason Neale (1818-1866) – with thanks to *Wikipedia*, *guernseydonkey.com*, *clausnet.com* & *classicfm.com*

Wenceslaus (c.907 – 935, a.k.a. Vaclac the Good) was Duke of Bohemia. His paternal grandfather had been converted to Christianity by Saints Cyril & Methodius. His mother's father was a pagan tribal chief, although she was baptized before she married. When Wenceslas' father died in 921, mother reverted to paganism and arranged her devout Christian mother-in-law's assassination. Bohemians chose Wenceslas to rule them, but to avoid disputes, Bohemia was divided between Wenceslas and his younger (jealous twin?) brother, Boleslaus the Cruel. Their mother was regent until Wenceslas' 18th birthday when he promptly banished her.

Wenceslas was a good ruler, an excellent administrator and revered for his kindness to the poor. He introduced education and successful law & order systems. On 28th September 935, as Wenceslas entered his chapel to pray, Boleslaus with three noblemen stabbed him to death. Wenceslas' last words were, "Brother, may God forgive you." Boleslaus was so revolted by what he'd done that he rejected the pagans who'd supported his bid for greater power and spent the rest of his life doing the kind of good deeds his brother had started.

Wenceslas was almost immediately regarded as a martyr, becoming patron saint of the Czech Republic. He wasn't promoted from Duke to King of Bohemia until Holy Roman Emperor Otto 1st gave him the title posthumously. One 12th-century preacher said of Wenceslas, "no one doubts that, rising every night from his noble bed, with bare feet and only one chamberlain, he went around to God's churches and gave alms generously to widows, orphans, those in prison and afflicted by every difficulty."

In 1582 a song about the coming of spring was published in a Finnish collection for schools. In about 1853, the British Envoy in Stockholm gave a copy of this rare book to John Mason Neale. Neale was interested in restoring Catholic ceremony, saints' days & music to the Anglican church. In 1849 he'd published *Deeds of Faith: Stories for Children from Church History* telling Christian legends (including St Wenceslas) in romantic prose. In his *Carols for Christmas-tide* (1853) he adapted the prose story into a poem, used the spring melody from the Finnish book, and added a reference to Saint Stephen's Day (26 December) to celebrate the long tradition of charitable giving on the Second Day of Christmas.

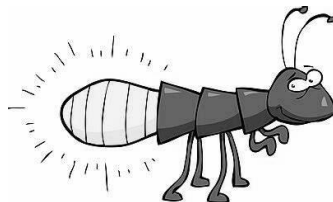
Some people really don't like this carol. It's been called the "product of an unnatural marriage between Victorian whimsy and the thirteenth-century dance carol", or "ponderous moral doggerel". The Oxford Book of Carols (1928) included it but commented this was "not without hope that, with the present wealth of carols for Christmas, *Good King Wenceslas* may gradually pass into disuse". But that hasn't happened: Although Christmas isn't mentioned, this carol's message of kindness, generosity and giving to those less fortunate than ourselves, is what makes it so fitting for the season. May we strive to emulate the Good King's example daily, not just at Christmas. Melinda Stone

Rev Peter's Green Page

I have been privileged to live in a farming area for some years now, and what is obvious is that farmers are great at looking after livestock and crops, but not themselves. They are state of the art when talking about animal health, soil health, and crop health, but not so when talking about their personal health and how to look after themselves as well as they do their livestock and crops.

It is a fact that people find it difficult to relate to the struggle of agricultural workers because they are in a minority, and sadly, undervalued. The truth is that while farmers have always faced unique challenges, the economic crisis had make matters much worse.

Nitrogen fertiliser has rapidly increased in price, from just over £200 /t in Spring to around £700 /t by the end of Autumn. Phosphate and potash prices have also increased by over 70 per cent over the same period. Grain feed prices have also been rising, leaving farmers questioning how fertiliser and other input cost increases can be managed and absorbed. All farms, especially pastoral ones, use electricity in their outbuildings and dairies, as well as diesel in their tractors, etc.

When the village pub was a focal point, farmers would meet regularly and exchange news and views and talk and listen. But now the village pub, as it was, is just a memory, and often farmers just struggle on, having no option other than to push themselves physically and mentally beyond where it's sensible.

Professor Matt Lobley, co-director of the Centre for Rural Policy Research, said: "The issue of the sense of disconnection between farming and non-farming people has come up repeatedly in our research over a number of years. We now know that the loneliness and isolation that can stem from this impacts the mental health of farming people. Farming people are key workers and we should all have a stake in helping improve their health and wellbeing."

The researchers also said there was a need to strengthen connections between farming and non-farming communities, whether that be by enhancing local opportunities for community engagement with agriculture, or more generally improving public dialogue in relation to food and farming. But they also called for a 'more positive and empathetic approach' from Government and regulators when it comes to shaping and enforcing policy and legislative requirements, particularly since associated paperwork and inspections have long been identified as key sources of stress for farmers.

We are lucky in our area in living in wonderful countryside, and this is because our farmers have tended and cared for it over generations. We should be very grateful to them, and appreciative of them.

Weather in October and Early November 2022 – Warm and Wet

Readers whose youth, like mine, was largely misspent may recall Albert Hammond's song of fifty years ago, 'It Never Rains in Southern California' the chorus of which went:-

It never rains in California
But girl, don't they warn ya
It pours, man, it pours

The weather this year has had elements of that about it; drought until mid-August, the summer heat and now autumn warmth and bounteous rain. For almost all of the time covered by this piece, winds have come in from the south blowing us in air of sub-tropical origin. Low pressure has taken up residence to the west of the UK ensuring this supply of warm moist air has continued. Looking at the 30 year averages over the last 60 years we could have expected daytime maximum temperatures in October varying between 14.58°C from 1971 to 2000 and 15.34°C from 1991 to 2020. This year the average daily maximum was just over 17°C. The warmest day was the 27th when the temperature almost reached 20°C and the coolest day was the 10th when the maximum was just under 16°C. It is unusual for there to be such a small difference between the coolest and warmest days just emphasising the consistent warmth of the month.

The average minimum temperature for October was 10.5°C with the warmest night on the 5th when the temperature did not fall below 16°C, a warm night even at the height of summer. The coolest night fell on the 11th with a minimum of just over 5°C. We had colder nights in May and September. The 30 year averages show a similar warming trend as the daily maximum temperatures and this October's average daily minimum was also about 1.7°C above the 1991 to 2020 average. I understand October 2022 was the fifth warmest of all time in the UK.

Perhaps the most unusual day in October was Sunday the 23rd when we experienced three thunderstorms, hot sunshine and some unusual clouds. Winds were lighter than usual with rainfall in fact slightly below average but there was enough to build on the cascades of September. If water companies' nerves were starting to twitch at another drier month these were rapidly allayed by the events of the first nine days of November when over six inches fell buffeted by strong to gale force winds at times. At 04:00 on the 1st there was a gust at Herstmonceux of 51 mph. Also, on the first day of the month there was more than twice the rainfall that fell in the whole of November 2021, admittedly a month of extremely little rain. Herstmonceux was the wettest place in the UK on the 6th. In the last three months we have had almost double the rainfall of the previous seven and a half months. Nature gives as well as takes away and the pattern of this year is strongly reminiscent of the weather in 1976.

As if to underline the warmth this autumn, Porthmadog in west Wales recorded a maximum temperature of 21.2°C on 13th November, this with the onset of meteorological winter just over two weeks away. It is set to be cooler for the rest of the month with temperatures returning to near average. Certainly, there is no sign of any cold weather yet. What might the winter hold? Liz Bentley, Chief Executive of the Royal Meteorological Society, tentatively suggested that in a La Nina year, as this one is, the coldest part of

the winter tended to be at the beginning with milder and more unsettled weather at the end. We will see.

COP27 has hardly yet brought any positive news in the battle against climate change and a cynic may be forgiven for suggesting that the population in the UK may not be entirely averse to the warmer weather we now seem to be enjoying; hardly an encouragement for us all to make the changes needed to parry the threat to the world as we know it. Just a thought.

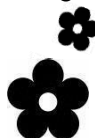
