## From the Rectory

Dear Parishioners,

I purchased a copy of National Geographic in April and the main topic for that month was air quality world wide. I had already realised that air quality isn't very good in our part of the world, but thought it was much better than many other places. However, there was much that shocked me in this edition of the magazine, things that I hadn't realised, for instance that our air quality in large parts of Europe are much worse than America, and that world wide 7 million people die prematurely due to air pollution every year. That is five times more than the number killed by motor accidents world wide.


Another thing that I did know is that world wide we are currently using up more resources than our world is able to produce in a year by around the beginning of August each year. The day this is calculated to happen is called 'Earth Overshoot Day'. But what I hadn't realised until recently is that we in the UK currently use up our share of what the world produces by early May!! So, here we are less than half way through the year and we have used up all we should have had already!! This overshoot has been happening increasingly ever since the early 1970's. There is always so much more to learn.

"The natural world is in our power, we can destroy or cherish. The choice is ours". David Attenborough

I don't believe that we are any happier than we were in the 1960's and early 70's, maybe less so? We certainly need to cut back drastically our consumption in many various ways here in the UK, whether we are happy or not, because it is unsustainable and it is destructive.

The simple Christian gospel message is very relevant here. For it is to 'repent and trust in God' (See Mark chapter 1 verse 15) The word 'repent' literally means to change your mind. We all, as a nation, need to seek to get back to living a life that is loving to everyone and caring regarding all has been provided around us, i.e. stop living selfishly and above our means as far as is possible. The second part is to do what the old sign outside the Brewers Arms said 'In God is all our trust' (see photo) and also what it is declared on every American \$1 Bill 'In God we trust'.

If we trust in the Christian God we have all our sins forgiven and we are given a fresh start time and time again whenever we go back to Him. With this wonderful boost from above we can all be full of hope for the future and determine to look for new ways of doing things and helping others around us as well.

### **Rev Peter Writes**

Over recent months, many have been suffering from depression. The loss of the ability to do what were once regarded as the simple daily things in life, has now made it obvious that the simple was the important. For many in this situation there has been found a refuge in a piece of music, a book, or some poetry. The problem is though that not everyone has the chance or the time to pause. It is not easy in these circumstances to be positive. A positive action, any positive action can take a huge amount of courage, and simply one day at a time can be frightening enough.

PTSD is usually thought to relate to one traumatic event, but now medical professionals recognise that continuous exposure to stressful situation can also result in this, this is known as Cumulative Stress Disorder (CSD). This can be caused by Regular and repeated exposure to verbal abuse, physical abuse, emotional abuse or threats as well as continuous feelings of captivation or powerlessness, and for some, the latter will now apply.

In 2020The BBC's Fergal Keane stepped down from his role as Africa editor due to posttraumatic stress disorder (PTSD), this diagnosis being the result of several decades of work in conflict zones around the world. As I wrote, music, books or poetry are an accepted way to help those suffering from depression, PTSD and CSD, for Fergal Keane however there was one particular poem that helped him. This was from 'Benedictus: A Book of Blessings by John O'Donohue,' and I leave it here:

> This is the time to be slow, Lie low to the wall Until the bitter weather passes.

Try, as best you can, not to let The wire brush of doubt Scrape from your heart All sense of yourself And your hesitant light.

If you remain generous, Time will come good; And you will find your feet Again on fresh pastures of promise, Where the air will be kind And blushed with beginning.

## **Rev Peter's Green Page**

In a recent edition of Dragon's Den, Deborah Meaden turned down the chance of an investment, because she had decided that she was not going to buy any new clothes this year, and so could not invest in a sports clothing company. Recycling is not simply limited to the correct container, it's also a way of donating still useful items that we no longer need of have a use for, to others or to help others. We as Church Communities do this, and our Pam Kendall is involved in this, and these are Pam's words:

"During the last few months we have been able to support Warming Up The Homeless. This charity works along the South Coast, Eastbourne, Bexhill, Hastings, and beyond, feeding and clothing. They make sure that people have the means to keep warm and also look after the welfare of their pets, often the only friend a homeless person has. They help people to find sheltered accommodation, making sure they have all the necessary amenities to live some sort of normal life, arranging medical care both for them and their pets.

I was pleased to deliver clothing donated by parishioners, sleeping bags/roll mats, knitted dog coats and food to the Bexhill Depot. I know that there were several church members who independently sent donations. This charity is always in need of warm, good condition clothing, shoes, anything that will make life on the streets more comfortable. Hot food is supplied each evening at known venues, so food stuff is gratefully received, and items, such as crisps, biscuit bars etc. for lunch bags are also needed. In addition they have a Bexhill charity shop that sells checked over donated items at 27 St Leonards Rd Bexhill, TN40 1HD and a distribution centre 8-12 Wickham Avenue, Bexhill, TN39 3EN that receives and sorts these donated items.

Members of our parish were able to support WUTH recently by donating clothing for both people and their dogs, food, sleeping bags as well as money. I was amazed at the work done by the volunteers, hot food delivered each evening donated and cooked by volunteers, breakfast and lunch parcels given to families in sheltered housing, supplying, where necessary, the means to cook, heat and look after themselves. The most important thing is – time to listen and this the volunteers do in abundance. They have a Facebook page and website, and they are on our Churches Website, please look at these."

#### <u>Wealden</u>

The Conservatives won again for East Sussex County Council and for Wealden District Council. People are saying no more houses, traffic gridlock, green fields being built on, then vote for more.

As we left the counting building at the National Golf Course Hotel in Halland, and came onto the road, the traffic from there to the Boship roundabout was chock a block.

Maybe we should be questioning the Appeal procedure in Bristol. Are they up for the job? Developers go to them and get their own way. Wealden are afraid to say no to planning applications, as the developers go to appeal and mostly win. Then we are having the issues we are trying to address.

All developers should be made to put solar panels on every roof, insulate every house, equip them with green energy, give large enough gardens so people can grow trees, fruit, veg and flowers. Cycle paths must be provided and local shops, to avoid getting into cars every day. That's if the government are serious about lowering emissions? You can't have it both ways. I can't believe that the Wealden Council has allowed such developments to go ahead. And more to follow.. thus creating more traffic gridlock and air pollution.

Also with this lock down, and people working from home, why is there not accommodation being added to the new homes where one can work from home, without having to work in one's living room? While one can't build a jet engine at home, how many have office jobs? One would have thought to include some light industry close to new large developments? This would go a long way towards reducing the travelling to work, with a reduction in traffic gridlock and air quality.

We are having reports of an increase in mental health issues and depression. I can understand why this is happening. People need exercise, a place to walk, have sport facilities for young people, a drop in centre for all age groups and a youth centre with someone employed to arrange events. Why is this not included in Hellingly or Stone cross area for example.?

Has Wealden Council ever had an interview with the MPs in Southern England to reconsider the state of developments taking place.

Why not build with a steel frame, off ground, with bolt on timbers, with sheep's fleece for insulation. thus helping the British steel industry, sheep farmers and flood risk? While growing more trees. While the Wealden Council declared a climate change emergency in 2019, do any of them realise housing costs, be it a mortgage or a market rent, which is creating much of the pollution they want to reduce, just see the traffic gridlock both morning and evening. Most of those travelling are doing so, just to pay for one of these awful unaffordable houses the planners give permission for.

#### Famous Hymns

How Great Thou Art: Carl Boberg (1859 – 1940) – with thanks to wordwisebiblestudies.com

Carl Gustaf Boberg was an evangelical Swedish pastor, and later a senator in the Swedish parliament. Walking home from the afternoon service in Monsteras one summer day in 1885, he got caught in a sudden thunderstorm - rolling thunder, torrential rain, then returning bright sunshine and birdsong overwhelmed him. He wrote an 8-verse song which he read in his church the next week and published in the Monsteras News in 1886.

Several years later, Boberg attended a church service and was surprised to hear the congregation sing his poem to an old Swedish melody. This was understated and sung in strict 3:4 rhythm – it's now sung with 4 beats in a bar. In the early 1900s, it was translated into German and shortly after from German into Russian and published in a Russian hymn book in 1922. English missionary Stuart Hine (1899 – 1989) and his wife were serving in the Ukraine in 1931 when they heard the song, and began using it in evangelistic services as a duet.

The Hines had to return to England in 1939, so Mr Hine paraphrased it into English. In 1948, Hine visited a camp in Sussex for displaced Russians, where only two were professing Christians. A man said he'd been separated from his wife at the very end of the war, and hadn't seen her since. At the time they were separated, his wife was a Christian, but he wasn't, but he'd since been converted. His deep desire was to find his wife so they could at last share their faith together. But he said he didn't think he'd ever see his wife on earth again. Instead he was longing for the day when they'd meet in heaven, and could share in the Life Eternal there. These words inspired Hine, becoming the basis for his fourth and final verse to 'How Great Thou Art': "When Christ shall come with shout of acclamation to take me home, what joy shall fill my heart. Then we shall bow in humble adoration and there proclaim, My God How Great Thou Art!"

In 1949, the Hines printed the song (with English translation) in their gospel magazine produced for refugees in Britain. So many requests came for a copy, from all over the world, that Stuart Hine had it printed in leaflet form. One of these was given to song leader Cliff Barrows, in 1954, who introduced the "new" hymn at Billy Graham's Toronto Crusade, in 1955. Billy Graham later said "The reason I like 'How Great Thou Art' is because it glorifies God. It turns Christians' eyes toward God, rather than upon themselves. I use it as often as possible because it is such a God-honouring song." By 1974, it was voted number one hymn in America. It's said that it was Elvis Presley's 1977 rendition of it that revived its popularity in Sweden! In 2013 it was voted BBC Songs of Praise's most popular hymn.

# Herstmonceux Community Land Trust

Strawberry Field, Windmill Hill is changing as Herstmonceux CLT moves closer to building homes aimed at local people. 8 will be sold to finance the project, 4 will be shared ownership to assist those with lower income or deposit, and 5 will be retained in perpetuity by the CLT for rent to those with local family or residence connections.

Preparatory activity included a CCTV survey of the sewer from the Windmill to Victoria Road, an archaeological survey, installation of dormice nest boxes in hedgerows and removing old leylandii trees along the public footpath. The trunks to be removed later.

Recognition is due to Joe Ayres who owned Strawberry Field and has supported the vision of CLT community homes during our 4 years of planning. For around 50 years the site grew strawberries and became known as Strawberry Field. The CLT wishes to recognise the history and will apply to Wealden DC for Strawberry Field to be the address of the new homes. We would welcome local support for this.

With detailed design, land purchase and finance in place we have chosen a main contractor with particular reference to costs, site management, community information and access to the on-site public footpath.

Work should start late July 2021 with a build time of 12 months. In cooperation with the main contractor, we will keep the community informed of progress. # A Time to Keep Silent and a Time to Speak

My dog, Mr Wiz has taught me much about communication. Victoria Stilwell, a dog trainer said "when a dog emotes the feeling is very pure and not complicated by complex human thought ". Dogs are very emotional creatures who seem able to tune into human emotions. I have found it fascinating.

Mr Wiz is very responsive to my emotions and senses my need for companionship and affection. If I am feeling a bit low, he will come and sit extra close to me and offer me his paw. He rarely ever barks and only when he is very excited, and it is like all his emotion just bubbles over and the bark is his exclamation of joy. He has taught me that words aren't always necessary. He manages to communicate all his needs and never utters a word. I have learnt to read his body language and that is how I know his needs.

We live in a noisy and busy world and I sometimes feel that it all gets too much. I live in a house with three other adults and lots of visitors which means that my own environment is often noisy, and Mr Wiz and I will retreat to the serenity and quiet of our own room at times.

Although I realise that I am blessed to live with people who all care and love one another it can also prove to be challenging doing all the brain gymnastics required for detailed conversations! Sometimes there are quite a lot of words and it has often made me wonder whether the spoken word is overused. Perhaps this is too radical a view as I know that conversation is a necessary part of human interaction, but it is something upon which I have reflected and wondered what our Lord would say.

When I pray alone I rarely say the words out loud. My conversation with God where I thank and praise him is a silent one within my own head. Mother Theresa said, "If we really want to pray, we must first learn to listen, for in the silence of the heart God speaks".

## Stella Hardwick's Memories of Windmill Hill

10th July 1977 the day that I, the new cooker and the TV aerial arrived at Windmill Hill, to be greeted by the resident house martins – and we are all still here in fairly good condition.

What did I know about Windmill Hill? Well, really not much as it was the view which sold the house to me! I had travelled by bus through the village and by bike to the original Horseshoe Inn.

There were three routes to Windmill Hill from my home at Stone Cross, but the one I knew best was the cart track across the marshes from Rickney to Herstmonceux. We didn't always get as far as that if we stopped at Mr. Chapple's farm at Rickney to go gleaning corn for the chickens at harvest time. However the incentive was often to head for the Horseshoe and return with bottles of Mr Simmons' very potent cider on board. We seldom saw anyone on the way, and usually stopped for a picnic somewhere near Horse Eye.

It was so peaceful there, though less so on one occasion in WW2 when my neighbours were cycling there and the nearby radar pylons were attacked. The only refuge was the ditches so they jumped in. Their clothes took a lot of cleaning later!

My other route via Windmill Hill was on the No 15 bus from Eastbourne to Hastings. It was often a spur-of-the-moment bus ride from the bus depot in Pevensey Road where you could leave your shopping at the left luggage office for a few hours. Those were the days too when parcels could be sent by a specific but to be met at your bus stop. The No 15 followed more or less the same route as does the No 98 now. We liked the front seats upstairs where there was a good view of the countryside, though you did have to bear with cigarette smoke as all the smokers had to sit upstairs.

So we trundled along and at last left Hailsham behind, which didn't take as long as it does now! Much more compact.... We knew we were coming into Herstmonceux when the New Zealand Tea Rooms came into view, later the site of Collins Garage. Up the hill with the Trug shop on the right and the cinema on the left. The bus stop was by the Brewer's Arms, but we looked out for the 'Praise the Lord' picked out in Cotoneaster on the wall of the house opposite. Further on was the teashop (now a restaurant) which I chiefly remember for the High Teas eaten there. What happened to High Teas? A hardboiled egg was a treat then. Further on we passed, in WW2, the Italian POW camp, and then to Windmill Hill with its rickety and rusty windmill, and then the more familiar Horseshoe.

The third route to Windmill Hill was by Wartling which I rarely used until my first driving lesson in early 1970's. It was a Sunday and, unlike now, very little traffic on it. It was held to be good for learning to steer the car, which was trusting of my instructor with water-filled dykes each side of the road! We passed through Wartling which, although my grandfather, David Delves was born there, I knew little about. My search for Grave's House came later.


