From One of the Ministry Team

Just recently somebody told me that everyone seemed grumpy. I am sure that this is an overstatement, but I have noticed when I do my weekly shop that a lot of people look worried. Almost every week it seems that some of the 'staple' foods have gone up in price, or else the quantity has gone down.

Certainly the annual rate of inflation is still above 10%. In the past 3 years we have all been going through extraordinary times. Just over 3 years ago we all experienced the first lockdown as a result of Covid. Freedoms we took for granted were suspended. Thankfully our world showed its resilience and vaccines were discovered, mass produced and rapidly distributed. Although Covid has not gone away, and there is no known cure as yet, it has become similar to flu in that there is some sort of control.

Levels of life and business began to get back to pre-pandemic levels, then in February 2022 Ukraine was invaded by Russia.

Most of us have not experienced the terrible consequences of a world war, although Russia has not started a world war we are living in very unstable times.

The Russian leaders aggression backed up by false propaganda have had a devastating effect on many people's lives. We all knew only too well the impact that this has had on heating costs – electricity, gas and oil. Increases in petrol and diesel have also had an upward pressure on transportation of raw and unfinished items. Inflation has rocketed so everything costs more.

One man's actions has caused so much grief to so many people, particularly to the Ukrainian population.

Thankfully many countries are helping, with Ukrainian refugees and also supplying help to Ukraine to stop the Russian advance, and also work to eject those invaders from Ukraine. We must pray for this aid to be continued. "All that is necessary for the triumph of evil, is that good men do nothing" words ascribed to Edmund Burke in the eighteenth century.

If we contrast this Russian action with Jesus. Then he will fade from memory, Jesus 2000 years after his death had and continues to inspire so many. Latest estimates put the number of Christians in our world between 31% and 32%.

Jesus did not come to impose his will, rather by his teaching and healing he showed people in the 1st Century AD right through to the present day how to live out our lives, by helping our neighbours whoever they maybe. In our present times of great difficulty, we can see the way people have rallied around to help others.

One more thing, we have just celebrated Easter, Jesus triumphed over death, showed himself to many people. Christians are Resurrection people. Jesus promised eternal life. We try to do what we can, sometimes we fail, but God is merciful, and his Son, Jesus intercedes on our behalf.

From the Cottage

We all bear scars.

I've been thinking about scars recently, especially when I read about Jesus appearing to his disciples and showing them the marks of his torture and death. The fact is that His resurrection did not erase the marks of having lived his life, or even having endured his death. I find it comforting that when Jesus rose from the dead He was recognisable by his scars, by his wounds.

And that is true for us also. We can only really know and be known when we talk about our scars. I never really feel a connection, to become close to someone until they have shared with me the broken parts of themselves. I am often inspired by the accomplishments of others I know, but I only feel that I know them fully when they feel confident enough with me to share their failures and hurt. As Beyonce said on her record, 'Sandcastles', "Show me your scars and I won't walk away".

Scars are the remains of our wounds, and they can be physical, mental and emotional. If you have been involved in abuse, deception or break up, then you will always be someone who was involved in abuse, deception or break up, there will always be that mark, that scar. Those scars never leave, because everything that has happened to you has happened to your body. Every act of violence and every hateful thing that has been said to us has happened to our bodies, and we carry all of it with us, like some unerasable computer hard drive, in some form or another. We, like Jesus, are the walking embodiment of our life story. The scars from that aren't optional, the pain can remain, but in the same way that Jesus still bore the marks of that pain, the pain did not define Him, and the marks of our past pain do not define us either.

When Jesus appeared to the disciples, He still bore his scars, just as we do. Our scars and our sorrow will always be a part of our story, but they will never be the conclusion of our story. This means that even when you feel trapped in your pain, trapped in your past, trapped in your own story as though it also is like a tomb, know this, there is no stone that God cannot roll away.

Famous Hymns

Alleluia! Sing to Jesus, William Chatterton Dix (1837-98) *with thanks to tribuneonlineng.com and to holytrinitymalvern.com*

This Ascensiontide poem, originally entitled "*Redemption by the Precious Blood*", was inspired by Revelation 5:9. You may remember William Chatterton Dix, a marine insurance agent whose "*As with Gladness Men of Old*" featured in January 2020's Parish News? Bedridden with a near fatal illness in 1866, Dix found the hope to pen these joyful words of victory, and it was first published in his *Altar Songs, Verses on the Holy Eucharist* in 1867. A year later it was included in the Appendix of *Hymns Ancient and Modern*, with a tune (rarely sung today) written specifically for it by Samuel Sebastian Wesley, called *Alleluia*.

Dix emphasises Christ being with us at all times as our redeemer, intercessor, Lord & friend; our heavenly manna, sustaining us with spiritual nourishment. The hymn praises Jesus for what he has done and is doing for us.

Verse 1 praises Christ for his victory at Easter - '*his the triumph, his the victory alone.*' In the Old Testament, the coming Messiah is pictured as sitting with his sceptre on a throne, both symbols of kingship and authority mentioned in line 2. Verse 2 praises Christ for His promises and reminds us of them: they're for all of us if we come to Him in faith, trust and accept Him. Jesus told his disciples he would not leave them "comfortless," a term which in the original Greek literally means '*orphans*' (see John 14:18-20) – the word used in line 1. '*Though the cloud from sight received him*' reminds us specifically of the Ascension and '*When the forty days were o'er*' counts the days from Easter to Ascension. Verse 3 praises Christ for his intercessions on our behalf, ever pleading with God for us, for our needs and forgiveness (see Hebrews 9:11). '*Thou within the veil has entered*' in verse 4 is a further reference to the Ascension.

Dix was a man of high churchmanship who felt the Church of England didn't have enough Communion hymns – he makes an obvious reference to communion in the very last line of this Ascensiontide hymn.

Alleluia! Sing to Jesus is commonly sung to the tune *Hyfrydol* – a Welsh word meaning 'delightful, agreeable, pleasing, pleasant, beautiful, fair, fine; sweet, melodious'. Its composer, Rowland Huw Prichard (1811-87, sometimes 'Pritchard'), lived most of his life around Bala, a small market town in the Snowdonia National Park. *Hyfrydol* seems to have been rather a one hit wonder - he wrote it when he was nearly 20 but sadly, apparently composed nothing else of note. *Hyfrydol* was originally published in Prichard's handbook to a children's songbook ("*The Singers' Friend*") in 1844. Best-known arrangements of the melody are by Ralph Vaughan Williams, who originally used it in his revision of the English Hymnal; he also composed some variations on this theme and it features as the third of his Prelude on *Three Welsh Hymn Tunes* (1955) for brass band.

Weather in March and early April 2023 – Spring Delayed

The weather in March proved to be a damp and dismal affair and not too warm either. I described in this column last month how the dry conditions of February and early March had given way to wind and rain. That change set the tone for the rest of the month. Rain fell on all but nine days. There was only one day in the second half of the month when there was no rain to measure. It was often windy. A sequence of depressions took up residence in the central Atlantic shovelling bands of rain across the UK. High pressure visited us only briefly before being summarily barged into Europe by the next Atlantic system. The month ended with a vigorous depression crossing England and Wales from the west to provide a climax to a very wet month when, all told, five inches of rain fell here in Cowbeech.

The average daily maximum temperature was a tiny bit lower than the comparable figure for February. There was little wind in February whilst the opposite was the case in March leading to much more wind chill which undoubtedly subdued daytime temperatures. The warmest day was the 29th when the temperatures reached only 14.5°C, low by the standards of recent years. The coldest day was the 8th when the daytime high was just under 4°C. By day, this March was the coldest since 2018 when 'the Beast from the East' paid us a visit. However, the strong winds and unsettled weather gave us relatively mild nights with only four air frosts in the month. The coldest night was on the 10th/11th with a low of -1.9°C whilst the warmest was on the 30th with a minimum of 10.5°C.

For the UK as a whole the warmest day was the 30th when Santon Downham in Norfolk hit 17.8°C but, if it was cold weather you were after, Altnaharra in northern Scotland was the place to go with daytime highs of only -2.4°C on both the 8th and 9th and an overnight low on the 9th of -16°C. Anyone in Capel Curig in Snowdonia on the 13th would have experienced a real drenching with 85.8 mm (3.38 inches) there that day. The sunniest place in the month was Aberdeen Airport on the 8th with 10.3 hours of bright sunshine, early in the month for the sunniest day, an indicator of how dreary much of the March weather was.

The long range forecast for April was quite upbeat but events in the first two weeks proved otherwise. The first four days were not too bad, dry but cold, particularly at night, with some sunshine. Rain arrived on the evening of the 5th with a wet night to follow. Maundy Thursday was a showery day with thunder heard in the early evening. Good Friday and Easter Saturday were fine once early mist and fog had cleared but Easter Sunday was marred by lingering mist until early afternoon when the sun shone briefly. It rained all morning on Easter Monday before an improvement later in the day but the next few days were stormy thanks to a visit by Storm Noa. Rain and showers were interspersed with drier spells but the wind blew relentlessly culminating in a gust of 54 mph at 16:00 on the 12th. The 14th was another wet and cold day but, as I complete this column on the 15th, a dry spell really does look in prospect now albeit with a chilly easterly wind.

It is often said that the weather in the USA comes to us a week later but thankfully that has not occurred. Indeed, there is little truth in that suggestion. California has endured yet another bout of severe flooding with huge dumps of snow in the mountains. Tornadoes have menaced the central plains whilst the mid-west has suffered several winter storms. All this activity has invigorated the Atlantic jet stream so although we have not experienced the weather in America it has certainly been responsible for the sub-optimal weather here in March and early April. I truly hope this column next month can be able to report on some spring warmth.

Rev Peter's Green Page

I am a Dandelion fan, and whether you love them or hate them, they are among the most familiar plants in the world, and quite possibly, the most successful plants that exist, masters of survival worldwide. Before the invention of lawns, people praised them and gardeners often weeded out the grass to make room for them, but somewhere in the twentieth century, humans decided that the dandelion was a weed and so the most unpopular plant, but it wasn't always that way.

To show the benefits of the once-loved plant, here are some things you might not know about them. Ancient Egyptians, Greeks and Romans enjoyed the flower, and they have been used in Chinese traditional medicine for over a thousand years. Dandelions were world-famous for their beauty, a common and loved garden flower in Europe and in Japan horticultural societies formed to develop new varieties. The use of dandelions in healing goes far back

For millennia, people have been using dandelion tonics to help the body's liver remove toxins from the bloodstream, and herbalists still welcome the dandelion as the perfect plant medicine: It is a gentle diuretic that provides nutrients and helps the digestive system function at peak efficiency. They were once used as healers of many ailments, but it wasn't until the twentieth century that the underlying cause of many of these symptoms was vitamin deficiencies. Dandelions have more vitamin A than spinach, more vitamin C than tomatoes, and are a source of iron, calcium and potassium.

Dandelion roots loosen hard-packed soil, aerate the earth and help reduce erosion. The deep taproot pulls nutrients such as calcium from deep in the soil and makes them available to other plants, so, while most think they kill lawns, dandelions can fertilise. As they are some of the first plants to flower, bees are attracted to them, but Herbicides used on lawns to kill dandelions take a toll on wildlife. Insects need them as a valuable nectar source, and insects are in deep decline. It has been shown that over 40% of all UK insects are declining, and a third are endangered, so just imagine how much help it would give to wildlife if some Dandelions were allowed to grow. Dandelions will never be eradicated, but perhaps we can learn to love them?

New Project with Herstmonceux Castle

Since December Validity Villages and Herstmonceux Castle have been clearing the small area of woodland, adjacent to the 1066 Footpath and opposite to Herstmonceux Church, to create a quiet space for walkers and the community to sit and enjoy the peace and quiet and the wonderful views across the Pevensey Levels.

Some ash trees, which were suffering from ash dieback have been felled along the edge of the site and we have are using the wood chips and branches to create paths, barriers and habitats for insects and small animals. The plan is not to make the area into a garden but to keep the wild habitat by encouraging woodland wild flowers and plants to flourish. The woodland is owned by Herstmonceux Castle, and community use of this space is not to create an alternative entrance to the castle but merely an opportunity to pause and benefit from the beautiful setting.

We have had lots enquiries about what we are doing and if you are interested in joining us to clear some of the nettles and ivy to give other species a start, we are usually there 10am to 12 mid-day on Fridays. Please contact me to check if we are planning to be there!

Herstmonceux Community Land Trust

The construction of homes at Strawberry Field, Windmill Hill, along with many construction projects was delayed due to volatility in construction costs, finance and wider political events. I am therefore pleased to give a positive update as follows.

Governance.

Herstmonceux CLT registered a Charitable Community Benefit Society (CBS), 'Herstmonceux Community Homes Trust Ltd' which will own and manage the 5 rental homes and the legacy elements of the project – the retained 25% of 4 shared ownership homes and the common asset spaces such as landscape, roads and parking. The market homes in the project will also benefit from the related maintenance agreement.

The existing CLT will become Strawberry Field Homes CIC (Community Interest Company) registered with the FCA and Companies House, which will build and sell homes before transferring the legacy assets to Herstmonceux Community Homes Trust. The Trust will be the sole shareholder and owner of Strawberry Field Homes CIC. All shareholding members of the HCLT will transfer to the CBS for the same share value and voting rights.

Members voted in favour of these changes and formal registration of the CIC is awaited. The benefits are the original principles of the CLT remain, the legacy homes remain asset locked for the community and our tax liability will be significantly reduced, helping viability and ensuring we continue to deliver the original and longstanding project aims.

Design & Planning.

We have revised the layout of the 8 market sale homes to be 3 bedroom – reflecting work from home potential - by utilising roof space and some additional dormers but without increasing the footprint or altering the site layout. Although a relatively minor change this has required us to seek revised planning consent which is now in hand.

Start-on-site.

Pre-construction contracts are being negotiated, the Section 278 road entrance certification is completed, and finance is in final approval. All being well, the intention is to complete the site entrance in May/June 2023 and start to build in July/August 2023. Information will be available as these matters fall in place and we will instigate regular updates for the community throughout the 12 month build period.

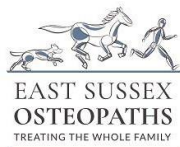
The bible tells us about how this happened, here is the story.

Social Prescribing

What is social prescribing?

Social prescribing is a key component of providing person centred care.

It is an approach that connects people to activities, groups, and services in their community to meet the practical, social and emotional needs that affect their health and wellbeing. In social prescribing, local agencies such as local charities, social care and health services refer people to a social prescribing link worker who give people time, focusing on 'what matters to me?' they support people to take control of their health and wellbeing.

Social prescribing link workers also support existing community groups to be accessible and sustainable, and help people to start new groups, working collaboratively with all local partners.

Social prescribing is an all-age, whole population approach that works particularly well for people who:

- have one or more long term conditions
- who need support with low level mental health issues
- who are lonely or isolated
- who have complex social needs which affect their wellbeing.

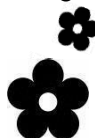
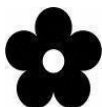

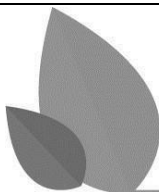
